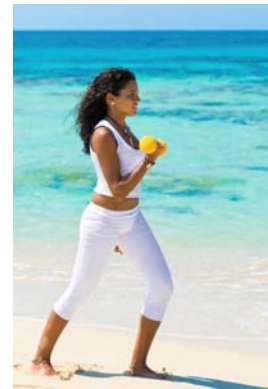

STC01 HISTORICAL CHURCHES (0830-1245 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 10/Maximum 50 (PRICE: \$33.00)

On this guided tour you will visit St. Croix’s historic churches that reflect the rich cultural diversity and religious tolerance that has characterized the islands since Danish times. Lutherans, Anglicans, Roman Catholics, Dutch reformed, Moravians and Jews all established places of worship during the 18th century.

STC02 CANE BAY BEACH BREAK (0830-1330 or 1500 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 20/Maximum 150 (PRICE: \$42.00)

If you’d like to spend a relaxing day at the beach, then this tour is for you. The gateway to underwater splendor, Cane Bay Wall is one of St. Croix’s famous diving spots. Here you will have the opportunity to dive “the wall”, swim, snorkel and see the many type of tropical fish and sea life. A complimentary drink and beach chair are included. Snorkeling and diving equipment is available for rental. Cane Bay’s white sandy beach is a perfect spot to relax while you enjoy your favorite drink and take in the trade winds on the north shore of St. Croix. For those wishing to eat lunch aboard ship, transportation back to the ship will be provided at 1330. For those wishing to spend more time at the beach, return to the ship will be at 1500.



STC03 WESTEND HIGHLIGHTS: BOTANICAL GARDENS, CRUZAN RUM DISTILLERY, AND WHIM PLANTATION MUSEUM – GROUP A (0900-1315 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 10/Maximum 100 (PRICE: \$49.00)



Voted by the rum industry as the best tasting rum in the world, Cruzan Rum is a locally-made beverage and a visit to its distillery is a notable introduction to St. Croix. For over 300 years the process of making Cruzan Rum has been a family tradition. A guide will lead you up the ladder to catwalks where you can look into gigantic open vats filled with the aromatic boiling brew. After the tour you can quench your thirst on a complimentary rum drink or one of their surprise specials.

Continue to Whim Plantation to get a taste of the rich culture this magnificent island has to offer. History comes alive as you stroll the lawn of this original 18th-century great house and ruins. You will be able to view the authentic furnishings as well as the whimsical windmills on the well-manicured grounds. The Danish West Indian furnished great house welcomes you with gracious guides waiting to tell you stories of past inhabitants and plantation life. Before you leave, don’t forget to visit the museum store where you can find a tempting cornucopia of West Indian crafts, artwork and books.

STC04 HISTORICAL WALKING TOUR OF CHRISTIANSTED (0900-1300 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 10/Maximum 100 (PRICE: \$44.00)

If you are seeking Danish architecture and graceful shaded archways, visit this picturesque town with its historical churches, quaint shops, museums, and fine restaurants. Christiansted is a place of rich culture and old world charm. After being transferred to Christiansted, you will be greeted by a guide and proceed on a walking tour. You will encounter the Steeple Building, the island's first church which is now a museum; Fort Christiansvaern, a yellow brick fort and dungeon built by the Danes to ward off pirates; the Apothecary Hall, an 18th century pharmacy; an old Danish Customs House; and, last but not least, the stately Government House.



STC05 BUCK ISLAND REEF NATIONAL MONUMENT: HALF-DAY SAIL (0900-1330 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 40/Maximum 75 (PRICE: \$69.00)

Enjoy an exciting powerboat ride touring the north shore of St. Croix on your way to exclusive Buck Island Reef. Snorkel the underwater trail and enjoy the incredible sight of a rainbow of corals and tropical fishes. Snorkeling lessons are given before you begin your water adventure. All snorkel gear and lessons are included. Sodas, water, and rum punch are also provided.

STC06 SCENIC ST. CROIX: CHRISTIANSTED, COLUMBUS LANDING & CANE BAY BEACH (0900-1200 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 10/Maximum 150 (PRICE: \$40.00)



From Columbus' landing to historical highlights to beaches, enjoy wonderful sights and breathtaking views on this educational tour. From the historical fort, churches and Danish buildings to one of the top dive spots "The Wall" at Cane Bay Beach and a visit to the tri-athletes' infamous hill, you will be provided with information on the culture and heritage of St. Croix. In addition, the many panoramic views provide excellent photo opportunities.

STC07 JEEP ADVENTURE (0900-1200 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 4/Maximum 26 (PRICE: \$99.00)

These one of a kind open-air guided jeep tours will take you off the beaten path to discover tide pools, breathtaking views, hidden sugar plantation ruins and much more! With your experienced guide at the wheel, you can let go of your worries as you take in the island's beauty on this once in a lifetime tour of St. Croix. Don't forget to bring your bathing suit, sunscreen, hat, water, and camera!

STC08 KAYAKING AT SALT RIVER (0900-1230 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 10/Maximum 30 (PRICE: \$69.00)

Kayak where Christopher Columbus set foot on St. Croix and follow in the footsteps of the Carib Indians. Featured on the Discovery Channel, this Ecological Preserve provides you the opportunity to view the mangrove forest and spy on snowy egrets and iguanas. Water and snacks provided. Beginners are welcomed!

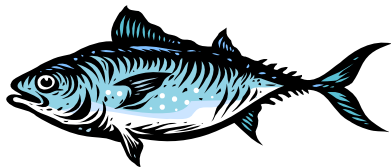
STC09 BOTANICAL RAINFOREST, LAWAEZT MUSEUM AND SPRAT HALL BEACH (0900-1315 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 10/Maximum 100 (\$49.00)

From 100 to 900 A.D. this lush tropical 16-acre garden was an Arawak Indian village. Over 1500 species of exotic, tropical and indigenous plants cover these grounds. Your guide will escort you through a natural forest, the ruins of a sugar mill and a cactus garden. These historical ruins are recognized as a National Historic District registered in the National Register of Historic Places. Venture along the scenic road that is canopied with many species of local trees to get to the rainforest. While exploring this beautiful greenery you will get the opportunity to sample tropical fruits such as tamarind, mango and genips, when in season. You will also be able to hear the sounds of the melodious creatures bringing the rainforest alive.



Lawaetz Museum at Estate Little La Grange is nestled in a tranquil valley on the western side of the island; this historic ruin is where you get the rich Danish history of our island. Listen to stories about the Danes, Africans, Americans, Irishmen, Englishmen and Dutchmen who lived on this former sugar and cattle plantation. This plantation has remained in the Lawaetz family since the 1750s. After leaving the Lawaetz Museum, transfer to Sprat Hall Beach. Bring your swimsuit if you wish to take a refreshing dip. Or, just relax and take in the astonishing view of the Frederiksted shoreline

STC10 SPORT FISHING ADVENTURE (0900-1200 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 6/Maximum 6 (PRICE: \$180.00)



Here's your chance to hook a big game fish such as dolphin, wahoo or tuna in the Caribbean Sea. Up to six guests will enjoy a private deep sea fishing adventure aboard a comfortable sporting powerboat. Explore one of the deepest trenches in the world with experienced fishing captains and take away memories of a lifetime!

STC11 FULL DAY CATAMARAN SAIL (0900-1500 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 20/Maximum 35 (PRICE: \$95.00)

On this one-of-a-kind sail along the route of historic Frederiksted to beautiful Sprat Hall Beach, aboard a 60' catamaran, enjoy the sugar mills that can be seen from the decks of the sail boat. After snorkeling at this gorgeous beach, a short sail will take you to Rainbow Beach, one of the Caribbean's best shoreline beaches. Here you will be spoiled with a local feast from "Rhythms Rest" on the beach! After a relaxing 45-minute sail, we will return to the ship.

STC12 NATURE WALK (0930-1200 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 10/Maximum 30 (PRICE: \$75.00)

Go off the beaten path and learn about the ecological landscape of the island. Nature enthusiasts should revel in St. Croix's unspoiled landscape and hidden natural treasures such as Maroon Ridge and Creque Dam. Your guide will educate you about the locally grown medicinal herbs and foods that grow in the wilderness.



STC13 HORSEBACK RIDING (0930-1230 Monday, 05 January) Minimum 8/Maximum 15 (PRICE: \$106.00)



Paul & Jill will take you from the hills and valleys to green pastures and white sandy beaches. Something they have been doing for over forty years at Sprat Hall Plantation. Riding through lush tropical trails near foothills of the rainforest and enjoying breathtaking views of the oceans, are just a taste of what this memorable ride has to offer our guest. Location breaks provide for great photo opportunities. Brief instructions are provided. Long pants, tennis shoes or boots are recommended. Beginners and advanced riders are welcomed.
